

Introduction to LEED and Wood Doors Program

Since the development of the LEED green building rating system, there have been many challenges for manufacturers as they work to develop new products that comply with the requirements of the various LEED rating systems. This program will review a brief history of LEED and its impact on the wood door industry. It will outline the different LEED rating systems and note differences between the ratings systems and how these differences affect the specification of wood doors. The program will also specifically discuss:

- The LEED credit categories to which wood doors contribute
- Wood door construction requirements for point category compliance
- FSC Certified Wood, Chain of Custody and Controlled Wood standards
- How controlled wood limits design choice on certified wood products
- What to expect in the near future

Our presenter will be Steve Farley of Marshfield Door Systems Inc., Steve has been in the door and hardware industry for 21 years and has worked for and represented many of the major manufacturers in the industry. Since joining Marshfield Door Systems in 2004, Steve has developed expertise in emerging green building programs such as LEED, and their associated product requirements.
